Teaching Orthodoxy...using Bible Verses Lesson 7:

We must start our life over...we must be born again by Water (Holy Baptism) and the Spirit (Holy Chrismation)

Do you not know that your bodies are **temples of the Holy Spirit**, who is in you, whom you have **received** from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies. 1 Corinth. 6:19-20

the glory that will be revealed in us. Romans 8:18

Then the righteous will **shine like the sun** in the kingdom of their Father. Matthew 13:43

Those who are wise will **shine like the brightness** of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, **like the stars** for ever and ever. Daniel 12:3

By **believing** and **receiving** Jesus and the Holy Spirit, we are **empowered by God** to become God's children.

But as many as <u>received</u> Him [Christ], to them gave He <u>power</u> to become the sons of God, even to them that <u>believe</u> on His name: John 1:12

Through this **Divine Power (**i.e. Grace of the Holy Spirit, Divine Enablement), we can and **must** <u>start our life over</u>...we must be <u>born again</u>...born from above.

Jesus answered and said unto him, "Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be **born again**, he cannot see the kingdom of God." John 3:3

Who were **born**, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but **of God**. John 1:13

It doesn't matter whether we have been circumcised or not. What counts is whether we have been <u>transformed</u> into a new creation. Gal. 6:15

Therefore **if anyone is in Christ**, **he is a <u>new creation</u>**. The old has passed away. Behold, the new has come! 2 Cor. 5:17

[*New Living Translation*: "This means that anyone who belongs to Christ has become a new person. The old life is gone; a new life has begun!"]

This **rebirth**—this new creation—comes through **Holy Baptism with Water** and **Holy Chrismation** (the Gift of the Holy Spirit):

Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, "Except a man be born of **water** and of the **Spirit**, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." John 3:5

Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the **washing of regeneration**, and **renewing** of the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:5

["regeneration" means "rebirth"; hence Baptism is a holy washing that gives a person a rebirth]

This is a **REAL event**, <u>not</u> just a nominalistic* symbol. In Holy Baptism, the Apostles taught that **we actually "put on Christ".**

For **as many of you** as have been **baptized into Christ have** <u>put on</u> <u>Christ</u>. Gal. 3:27 ["Baptized" = to submerge, dip, sink, wash]

[*Nominalism is human philosophy which says spiritual things such as Sacraments "are not real, but are **only 'noms', or names**". Nominalism is a <u>heretical</u> rationalistic skeptical way of denying, step by step, everything Christ taught the Apostles. But for the Orthodox, the Sacrament of Holy Baptism is a REAL EVENT, a true Mystery, a meeting of God and one's soul.]

In the **Holy Mystery of Baptism**, we participate in the victorious reality of Jesus' Death and Resurrection. We actually **UNITE with Christ**. We put HIM ON. **We put GOD on**. United to Him, His victory becomes ours.

We were therefore **<u>buried</u>** with Him through <u>**baptism**</u> into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may <u>live a new life</u>. Romans 6:4

Having been **buried with Him in baptism**, in which you were also **raised with him** through your faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead. Col. 2:12
